





Saints and Feasts of the Week

<u>All Saints Day</u> - Feast Day is Nov. 1st. Also known as All Hallows' Day and Solemnity of All Saints, it's a Christian solemnity to honor all the saints of the church, known or unknown, who are in Heaven. People celebrate by lighting candles and going to church. It's celebrated by the Roman Catholic Church as well as many Protestant churches.



St. Martin de Porres - Feast Day is Nov. 3rd. He was a Peruvian lay brother of the Dominican Order, known for his devotion to the Eucharist and constant prayer. He had great compassion for all races of people and even extended loving care to animals. He's the patron saint of multiple manual labor occupations, mixed-race peoples, and animals.



St. Charles Borromeo - Feast Day is Nov. 4th. He was the Archbishop of Milan and a cardinal of the Catholic Church. He was responsible for significant reforms, including the founding of seminaries, and received a doctorate in civil and canon law. He's noted for caring for the poor during the plague and his emblem is humilitas (humility). He's the patron saint of bishops, catechists, and seminarians.
