



<u>St. Augustine</u> - St. Augustine was a theologian, philosopher, skilled preacher, & bishop of Hippo (now Annaba, Algeria) in North Africa. His writings influenced

He was one of the most important Church Fathers of the Latin Church in the Patristic period as well the most significant thinker after St. Paul.
