Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe November 23, 2025

FOCUS: Jesus is king of all creation.

Today's solemnity, which marks the close of the liturgical year, reminds us that Christ is king, judge, and ruler of all. He is the image of the invisible God and the firstborn of all creation in whom all power and authority have been invested. By our baptism we share in that royal identity so that we might witness to his glory and kingship before the world.

THE HERO KING FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

Some think of a myth as something once presumed to be true but discovered to be false. For example, we say it's a myth that Christopher Columbus discovered America. There is, however, another quite different meaning to "myth," as in a story that helps us understand life and how to negotiate it. Such myths are often centered around heroes who overcome great odds for the sake of the greater good. Star Wars and Luke Skywalker is one such myth. The Lord of the Rings trilogy and Frodo Baggins is another. These are myths capturing the need for courage and commitment to the good at the hero's own expense. We often find ourselves wishing we could be like these heroes.

The biblical story of the Hebrew people can be thought of as such a myth, culminating in the story of Jesus. It differs from those other myths in that this story is not fiction. It is a saga that helps us understand and negotiate life as we live it. It culminates with the sacrificial death of the one we call King of the Universe. This King is a servant-king, one who gives his life for us so that we might live. Despite being urged by religious leaders and soldiers and the thief on the cross to save himself, he resists. Saving himself is not what he is about. Jesus is the King whose true myth we tell whenever we come together.

Reflect: What does servant-leadership mean to me in my job, my community, my home?

Why is a US secular holiday like Thanksgiving on the Church's liturgical calendar?

Since November 1969, the Proper Calendar offers a Thanksgiving Day Mass for US dioceses. While it also includes Independence Day, no suggestion is made for other civic holidays (Memorial Day, Labor Day, etc.). Instead, the Roman Missal provides "Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions" that are suited to these observances (Ordo #5, GIRM 368–378). In the United States, November is associated with giving thanks to God. In 1623—three years after the Pilgrims sailed to this land on the Mayflower—a severe drought threatened their crops. Consequently, a day of prayer was observed, an abundant rain saved the harvest, and a Day of Thanksgiving was established. In 1863, President Lincoln issued a proclamation for "Thanksgiving and Praise to Our Beneficent Father" on the last Thursday of November (later moved to the fourth Thursday). However, thanking God isn't just a one-day event; it's meant to be a perennial practice. Recall the lesson of the ten lepers healed by Jesus, only one of whom returned to thank him. (See Luke 17:11–19.) People who don't take their blessings for granted return thanks to God in prayer. Therefore, offer brief prayers of gratitude to God throughout the day, every day, for such gifts as your health and faith, the freedoms allowed in this country, "thy daily bread," and the Eucharist—a word that means "thanksgiving." "Become what you pray"—a grateful disciple of our Lord!

FEASTS AND SAINTS OF THE WEEK



St. Andrew Dung-Lac & Companions - Feast Day is November 24th. This feast day commemorates St. Andrew Dung-Lac as well as 116 others, who were martyred for their faith in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862. They included 96 Vietnamese, 11 Spaniards, and 10 Frenchmen composed of 8 bishops, 50 priests, and 59 lay Catholics. St. Andrew was a Catholic convert, who was ordained to the priesthood and worked in missions in Vietnam. He along with the others suffered severe persecutions and martyrdom, which were ordered by the emperor. This feast celebrates their courage and sacrifice for the Christian faith and serves as an inspiration for the faithful on their faith journeys. This group, along with members of a companion group who also gave their lives between the 17th and 19th c., were all canonized in 1988 by Pope St. John Paul II. The message of their martyrdom is this: "Life on earth is very short and what truly matters is our faithfulness to God."

St. Catherine of Alexandria - Feast Day is November 25th. This 3rd & 4th c. virgin martyr was born in Alexandria, Egypt, and died there at the age of 18. After receiving a vision, she converted to Christianity and was known for her intellect, faith, wisdom, and debating skills. She debated 50 pagan philosophers, who became Christians and were all martyred. Since she refused to marry the emperor, she was condemned to death. Bound to a spiked wheel which was supposed to kill her, she instead broke and shattered it, which injured her executioners. She was then beheaded and it was said that angels carried her body to a monastery at the foot of Mt. Sinai. She became one of the 14 Holy Helpers, who have been venerated together, especially in Germany and Hungary. She's the patroness of philosophers, librarians, students, teachers, and lawyers. She is also believed to help protect against sudden death.





Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal - Feast Day is November 27th. This feast commemorates the 2nd apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary to St. Catherine Laboure in Paris in 1830, in which she revealed to her the design for a special medal to be struck. It was to include symbols of her immaculate conception and her role in salvation history. She promised abundant graces to those who wear it with devotion, confidence, sincere faith, and prayerfulness. The first medal was produced in 1832 and it quickly became a popular and treasured sacramental in the Catholic Church, due to the many miracles that were attributed to it. It was originally called the "Medal of the Immaculate Conception," but then quickly became known as the "Miraculous Medal" due to its many miracles of healings, conversions, and other ones including protection from harm.


