

FOCUS: *Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing.*

In today's readings Isaiah, Paul, and John the Baptist rejoice because they have Good News. God is with them and working through them. They are anointed, blessed, and sent to do God's will. On this Gaudete Sunday, we, too, find reason to rejoice. Let us rejoice in sharing the Good News of Christ.

Third Sunday of Advent

The main theme for the third week of Advent is <u>Joy</u>. The pink candle symbolizes rejoicing and is known as the "Shepherd's Candle." The color for the priest's vestments is rose. During the third week of Advent, we are filled with joy for the near arrival of Jesus on

Christmas day. This Sunday is often called "Gaudete Sunday" as we reflect on the joy the shepherds felt at the birth of Jesus.

Dear Padre

Was Jesus born in a stable or a cave? The Christmas scene in our church has Jesus born in a little shed, but in my friend's church it looks more like a cave. The Bible says Jesus was born in a manger, so just where was Jesus born?

The Christmas scenes, sometimes called Nativity scenes or crèches, vary from church to church. In Scripture, we find more details about the Nativity in Luke's Gospel, but even he simply says that Mary wrapped Jesus in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger because the inn was full (Luke 2:7).

In none of the Scriptures do we have any details about what the place looked like, but since a manger is a place where caregivers feed livestock, we can assume that Jesus was born in a stable of some kind. At that time, small caves sometimes were used as stables.

Nativity scenes, though, are not an attempt to present a historically accurate picture of where Jesus was born. Rather, scenes of the birth of Jesus remind us of the special love that God shows for us in sending the Son to us. We do not care so much about creating an exact picture of what took place as we do of beholding the beauty and wonder of God born among us.

New Norm Regarding EM's taking Communion to the Homebound

In order to safeguard the sacredness of the Holy Eucharist, Bishop Silva has forbidden that the Eucharist be given to anyone presenting a pyx in the Communion line. Only those who are authorized by the parish priest to take Holy Communion to the sick may receive the Eucharist from the priest after the Communion of the faithful, and never during the Communion procession.

Saints and Feasts of the Week

<u>Saint Peter Canisius</u> – Feast Day is December 21th. He was a Dutch Jesuit priest and a Doctor of the Church through his teaching, preaching, and writing of catechisms. He was known for his strong support for the Catholic faith during the Protestant Reformation in Germany. He was an excellent example of the scriptural man, who developed his talents for the sake of the Lord's work. He is the patron saint of Germany.

St. John of Kanty – Feast Day is Dec. 23rd. He was a Polish priest, whose parents named him John Cantius. He was a scholastic philosopher, physicist, and theologian. He was known for his humility, generosity, and compassion toward the poor, especially needy students at the university. He is the patron saint of Poland and Lithuania, teachers, students, priests, and pilgrims. He even made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem in the hope of being martyred. He is honored in Catholic liturgy by 3 hymns.
