

# Fourth Sunday of Lent March 19, 2023

Readings for next week:

Ezekiel 37:12-14

Romans 8:8-11

John 11:1-45

<u>FOCUS</u>: *Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness.* 

Sometimes doing God's will can seem strange, foolish, or even wrong to others. Jesse assumed his youngest son couldn't be the next king, so David was left to care for the sheep when Samuel came. The Pharisees thought Jesus sinned by healing on the sabbath. Are we preoccupied with what others will think, or are we focusing on doing God's will?



## Palm Sunday

We are halfway through Lent already and soon it will be Holy Week. **Palm Sunday**, which begins Holy Week, falls on **April 2<sup>nd</sup>** this year. It commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem just days before

he was crucified. It was customary practice for people to wave palms or small branches as a show of respect. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey and to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw their clothes and waved their palms in front of him as a sign of homage. The palms are widely known as a symbol of peace and the use of a donkey represents the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed of war. 

# **Scrutinies**

The Scrutinies are a series of rites for adults who wish to be baptized. They are celebrated in the third, fourth, and fifth weeks of the Lenten season. This is considered a period of purification and enlightenment for the elect. There are prayers of exorcism, which are intended to help purify the elect from sin and sinful desires. The overall prayers and laying on of hands are to help the elect be enlightened by the Word and grace of God.

- Jesus encountering the Samaritan woman at the well, where He offers Himself as the Living Water,
- Jesus healing the man born blind, where He gives Himself as Light of the World, and
- Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead, where He reveals Himself as the Resurrection and the Life.








# **Catholic Relief Services**
