

1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a

Romans 9:1~5

Matthew 14:22-33

<u>FOCUS</u>: The Father instructs us to *listen*, and the Son encourages us, *do not be afraid*.

On the mountaintop we hear two direct commands: *Listen to him* and *Do not be afraid*. Think of what we might be afraid of. Maybe following Jesus will change us. Perhaps God's call will mean facing things that are unpleasant. We may even be afraid that decisions made on the mountaintop with Christ will be hard to live out in normal life. Listen to the Lord, and fear not – trust in the power of God.

Mass Intentions and Book of Intentions

Starting this week, we will be offering Mass Intentions for your loved ones. It will be one intention per Mass, per day. Please come to the office to schedule and fill out a Mass Request Form. Availability on the date depends on the intentions we get for the week. Should there be a conflict on the day you request, we can arrange another date to accommodate your intentions. Also, we can have collective intentions should the families agree to have the intention said on the same day and time. The suggested donation is \$20 per Mass intention (a \$10 stipend goes to the priest as determined by Diocesan policy while the remaining \$10 goes to the Repair and Maintenance Fund or to other church needs as determined by the pastor).

For those who may want to have their intentions offered, the Book of Intentions will still be available.

Please note that Mass intentions cannot be scheduled for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil or All Souls Day. One Mass every Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation must be scheduled for the intentions of our parishioners as Pro Populo (For the People) as required by Canon Law.


Get your tickets for our Bingo Night, which will be held on:

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus took three of His Apostles up a mountain where they saw Him shining like the sun, and talking with Moses and Elijah. They were talking about how Jesus was going to go to Jerusalem and be killed. The apostles were amazed and confused.
