Second Sunday of Advent December 7, 2025

FOCUS: Christ will bring us to new life and new growth.

Through Jesus, God fulfilled the promise he made to his people to bring them salvation. Christ's death and resurrection opened the way for eternal life for all who believe, including the Gentiles. Let us prepare the way of the Lord by asking for God's healing, listening for God's voice, and raising our hearts to him.

WILL YOU NOTICE THE SHOOT? ANN M. GARRIDO

Today's first reading from the prophet Isaiah offers a familiar Advent image: the shoot sprouting from the stump of Jesse. The verses immediately preceding speak of God walking through the forest with an ax: "The tall of stature shall be felled, and the lofty ones shall be brought low" (Isaiah 10:33). But now, amidst all the destruction, a tiny sign of new life emerges, and the Spirit of God descends upon it, bearing many gifts—wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, awe, delight. So often, when we scroll through the news, our attention is captured by violence and war and the "mighty" who make great noise when they fall. "Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees," echoes John the Baptist in today's gospel. If we are looking for where God's Spirit can be found, however, Isaiah reminds us we will need to look elsewhere. We will need to attend to the quiet, fragile resurrections taking place below the surface when it appears as if all has been lost. If we seek wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, awe, and delight, we will need to look where the little ones of the earth are found. We must have our eyes open for the shoots. The gospels emphasize that Jesus was one such little one. Although the glory days of his people seemed to have come to a crashing close, they have not. In him, we glimpse the truth that life is stronger than death. We see that the future has not been erased, no matter how terrible the past. In him, we find our hope.

• Reflect: Are my eyes open to the small signs of God's work in the world, or am I too distracted to notice?

Do non-Catholics go to heaven?

Yes, they do, because of the grace of God at work in his people. To suggest otherwise would seem to imply that Catholics somehow have a "golden ticket," or some kind of right that simply does not exist. The Incarnation of Jesus healed the division between heaven and earth, a division established by the "sin of Adam" and confirmed by our own lives of sin. Through his passion, death, and resurrection, all has been restored to the manner that the Father first envisioned through his Creation. The division was between humanity and divinity, not between religious practices and divinity. Catholics believe and celebrate that God accepts all people of a good heart and a good spirit. God is not blinded by the labels that sometimes blind his people to the bigger reality. When Catholics, or people of any religion, proclaim exclusivity and specialness, particularly when it concerns eternal life, all people should be very cautious about what they assume. To assume a certain type of arrogance—to yourself and to your belief and life of faith—that excludes others or separates another as "not one of us" simply has no place in the kingdom of God.



FEASTS AND SAINTS OF THE WEEK



St. Ambrose - Feast Day is December 7th. This 4th c. theologian, bishop, and one of the 4 original Doctors of the Church was one of the most notable men of that time. Working as a young lawyer in Rome, he later became a governor for his oratory skills and promotion of peace. He was later baptized and consecrated as bishop of Milan. Known for his generosity, he gave his money and estates to the poor. He was nicknamed the "Honey-Tongued Doctor" for his speaking skills and according to legend, a swarm of bees descended on him as an infant. He played a key role in the conversion of St. Augustine and was known for his strong stance on church authority. As a highly influential bishop, he composed some of the earliest hymns and introduced the lectio divina as a prayerful meditation of scripture. He's the patron of Milan, beekeepers, bishops, candlemakers, and students.



St. Juan Diego - Feast Day is December 9th. The feast of this Mexican Saint, who lived during the 15th & 16th c., has been celebrated in conjunction with the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe on Dec. 12th. They're observed together, as they are both part of the same story; multiple apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary to St. Juan Diego and her image on his tilma (cloak). His role was to convince the bishop to have a church built in her honor, which was her request. Doubting the validity of the apparitions, the bishop finally believed when roses (that bloomed on the barren Tepeyac Hill in winter) fell from this saint's tilma with her image imprinted on it. This Aztec saint is the first indigenous saint of the Americas as well as its patron. The apparitions led to mass conversions and the spread of Christianity. He spent the rest

of his solitary life dedicating his life to the BVM in the basilica built. His tilma is perfectly preserved and on display there after surviving some disasters.



St. Lucy - Feast Day is December 13th. Also called "St. Lucia's Day," this feast commemorates the 3rd & 4th c. young virgin martyr, St. Lucia of Syracuse (in modern day Sicily). She dedicated her virginity to God and desired to serve the poor. She brought food and aid to Christians hiding in the catacombs by wearing a candle-lit wreath on her head to light her way and leave her hands free to carry as much food as possible." Having refused marriage to a pagan" suiter who accused her of being a Christian, her eyes were gouged out but were miraculously restored. She was finally executed by a sword in her neck. Her feast day is celebrated in various parts of Europe, especially in Scandinavia, where festivals are held in her honor to symbolize light over darkness (her name means "light").

Children dress in white, wear crowns with candles, and bake buns to share. Processions are held in churches as well. She's the patron of the blind & those with eye disorders, electricians, glassblowers, Syracuse, and the Caribbean island of Saint. Lucia.
