



## Should We Let Others See What We Do for God?

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus warns the people about some of their leaders. They wore special clothes and made sure that people saw them giving to the poor. They also got the best seats at gatherings. These men were only concerned about outward things and not about being holy and loving in their hearts.

Our Lord wants us to be holy on the inside- to love Him and to love everybody

else with our hearts. But we don't always have to show it on the outside. Sometimes we pray together or help people when others can see us, but we should often pray and do good in ways that people won't see, too.

Still, there are some people who do wear special clothes and should get places of honour. Priests and religious sisters and brothers wear clothes that help us to know that they have special jobs. They aren't trying to get attention, but it is a sign that they have given themselves to God. We treat them with extra respect because they have dedicated their lives to God.

## Saints and Feasts of the Week



<u>Dedication of the Lateran Basilica</u> - Feast Day is Nov. 9<sup>th</sup>. This feast marks the dedication of the Cathedral church of Rome, also known as the Basilica of St. John Lateran, by Pope Sylvester I in 324. It was the first basilica where Christians could worship freely in public after centuries of persecution. We're reminded that each person is "house of God" in the Risen Jesus, as the Holy Spirit dwells in each one of us. The main altar contains the relics of Sts. Peter and Paul.

<u>St. Leo the Great</u> – Feast Day is Nov. 10<sup>th</sup>. Also known as Pope Leo I, he was bishop of Rome in the 5<sup>th</sup> century. He's best known for having met Atila the Hun in 452 and persuading him to turn back from his invasion of Italy. He's also noted for his spiritually profound sermons, which stressed almsgiving, fasting, and prayer. He was only one of two Popes to be recognized as a Doctor of the Church.



St. Martin of Tours – Feast Day is Nov. 11<sup>th</sup>. Also called Martin the Merciful, he was one of the most familiar Christian saint in France during the 4<sup>th</sup> century. He was a gentle, humble servant of God, known best for helping those most in need. He served first as a soldier but lived more like a monk. He is the patron saint of beggars (on horseback, he shared his cloak), wool-weavers and tailors, the Third Republic, and geese.
