

Readings for next week:


Genesis 15: 1-6; 21:1-3



### DEAR PADRE

December 24, 2023

The Bible talks about Jesus' brothers and sisters. Is there scriptural proof that Jesus was Mary's only child?

The Catholic Church's position is that Mary had only one child; her son called Jesus. Yet there are at least ten scriptural references to "the brothers of Jesus" or to his "sisters" (see Matthew 13:55–56, Mark 6:3, and Luke 8:19–21).

The difficulty is that the meaning of the term "brothers" (translated from the Greek *adelphos*) isn't restricted to the sharing of a parent. On the contrary, it may not only refer to other relatives, including cousins, but also to close relationships, such as disciples. This is not unlike how we might refer to "brothers in arms" as those who fought in a war together, or a religious order of brothers or sisters.

Recall, too, that Jesus and his disciples spoke Aramaic, and there is no equivalent for the meaning of "cousins" as we know it in that language. Instead, the word for brother or sister was used when referring to cousins. Thus, when St. Jerome (*circa* 340—420) translated the Bible from Hebrew into Church Latin, he considered "the brothers of Jesus" as cousins, not siblings. After all, it would have been the rightful responsibility of these male relatives of Jesus to take care of Mary when Jesus died. Yet Jesus entrusts his mother to the care of his beloved disciple John (John 19:26).

#### Saints and Feasts of the Week

**Saint Stephen** - Feast Day is December 26<sup>th</sup>. H was the first deacon and first martyr of Christianity. He was known for having great faith, caring for the poor, and being full of the Holy Spirit which enabled him to perform miracles in synagogues. He was stoned to death as a result of his teachings and accused of blasphemy, but he forgave his attackers as Christ had done on the cross. He's the patron saint of bricklayers and stonemasons.

**St. John, Apostle and Evangelist** - Feast Day is December 27<sup>th</sup>. He was the youngest of Jesus' 12 Apostles, the Beloved Disciple, and an Evangelist, having authored the Gospel of John, 2 New Testament letters, and Book of Revelation. He was the model of true friendship and devotion to Jesus, true humility, and holy confidence. His gospel is very personal and conveys both the divine and human natures of Jesus and records his 7 miracles. He's the patron saint of love, loyalty, friendships, and authors.



<u>Feast of the Holy Innocents</u> — Feast Day is December 28<sup>th</sup>. This feast refers to the killing of male children 2 years old and under in the Bethlehem area by orders from Herod the Great, king of Judea, after Jesus was born. They were innocent of any crime and considered "holy" by the church, because of the holy circumstances of their death. The story of this massacre is told in the Gospel of Matthew. They are venerated as martyrs not only for Christ, but instead of Christ. This feast shows how much God loves babies, even sending His own Son to be born into the human family.
