## Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross September 14, 2025

FOCUS: In the cross is our hope.

The cross, a horrible instrument of death, can be celebrated because there is no evil, no pain, no darkness which cannot be transformed by Christ. He enters into whatever we may be confronting to bring his perfect love, goodness, truth, and life to us. Lift high the cross, for through it, God has worked our salvation.

## WHEN LIFE IS ON EMPTY FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

As he stood in line in front of me, the back of his T-shirt read, "Pain is weakness leaving the body." Though unsaid, it implied that the parting pain would be replaced by newfound strength. Yet, the more I thought about it, I wondered if that is always the case. Some pain simply leaves one empty, like the grief that comes with the death of one's child. That emptiness never leaves, it is never replaced. So too, the pain of living with mental illness, as it seems to isolate one from many of life's joys and satisfactions. Or, eventually, the aging process in all of us, as it slips in and steals the treasures of life, one by one. Pain is not always weakness leaving the body. Sometimes, it is the pain of an alien spirit settling in for the long haul.

If St. Paul's assertion that Jesus came and "emptied himself...coming in human likeness...even [to] death on a cross," then those times that seem to empty us of all we would hold dear are the times when we slowly take on the image of Jesus in our own lives. It is at such times when we are most powerless but also when God's spirit shines through our broken and wounded lives, if only because we become totally dependent upon God. It is Saint Teresa of Kolkata who is said to have once remarked that even God cannot fill what is already full.

■ <u>Reflect</u>: What emptying am I experiencing? Can I accept it as becoming more like Jesus?

## Dear Padre,

September 14, 2025

A Protestant friend tells me that Jesus died to take the punishment for our sins. That doesn't seem accurate to me. What does the Church teach about the meaning of Jesus' death on the cross?

Jesus understood his mission to be sacrificing his own life "as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28). His fidelity to that mission was even at the cost of death. However, saying Jesus' death was payment for our sins doesn't mean that a vengeful God was appeased by the slaughter of his own innocent son. Rather, we are redeemed because of the mutual love between Father and Son, as well as the love Christ had for us all when he offered his life. "It is love 'to the end' (see John 13:1) that confers on Christ's sacrifice its value as redemption and reparation, as atonement and satisfaction" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 616). It is in this sense that Jesus' death was a payment—not one to be exacted—but a unique sacrifice "that completes and surpasses all other sacrifices," when "the Father handed his Son over to sinners in order to reconcile us with himself," and the Son of God freely and lovingly offered his human life to his Father "in reparation for our disobedience" (CCC 614). Christ "bore our sins in his body upon the cross.... By his wounds you have been healed" (1 Peter 2:24). Viewed in light of the resurrection, Christ's death has meaning in eternal life's triumph over sin.

#### FEASTS AND SAINTS OF THE WEEK



<u>Our Lady of Sorrows</u> - Feast Day is Sept. 13<sup>th</sup>. This feast commemorates the seven sorrows that the Blessed Virgin Mary experienced throughout her life. Recorded in Scripture, they are: the Prophecy of Simeon, flight into Egypt, loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple, Mary meets Jesus on his way to Calvary, the Crucifixion and death of Jesus, Jesus taken down from the cross, and Jesus laid in the tomb. Simeon's prophecy of Mary's heart being pierced was the first scriptural record of her knowing that her Son would suffer. The other six sorrows depict a developing picture of the fulfillment of that prophecy and express the deep sorrow that she endured. There are also promises for those who honor her sorrows and promote this devotion, which started to develop in the 11th c. The Servite Order took up this devotion in the 13th c. for their order.



St. Joseph of Cupertino - Feast Day is Sept. 18th. This 17th c. Italian, who was an OFM Conventual Franciscan friar, was also honored as a Chrisitan mystic. Lacking all kinds of virtues, he was considered mentally disabled by being absent minded and wandering around aimlessly. Known as "The Flying Friar," he performed feats of levitation and ecstatic flights during Mass and prayer, such as floating in the air and soaring to high altars. Having done these about 70 times, he expressed deep prayer, which raised his mind and heart to God. He is also credited with reading minds, having visions of future events such as the Pope's death, and helping students pass difficult exams. He's thus the patron saint of aviation, astronauts, mental handicaps, test taking, and students.



Our Lady of La Salette - Feast Day is Sept. 19th. This Marian apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary occurred in 1846 in La Salette-Fallavaux, France in the French Alps, when she appeared to two young shepherd children. This beautiful lady, who appeared to be weeping, gave them a message of repentance for sins committed, especially of a deep lack of respect for the Sabbath and for God's name, or there would be impending disasters of sickness, war, famines, and persecutions. In 1851, the local bishop formally approved this apparition, had a shrine established on the site, and authorized devotion and prayers to our Lady. In 1852, a congregation of priests, the Missionaries of La Salette, was founded to spread her message of conversion, reconciliation to God, and hope in the promise of mercy. This site is a major pilgrimage destination with its miraculous spring, which has brought many miraculous healings and transformed lives.
