



# March 3, 2024

# My thoughts are my worst enemy. Sometimes they turn to lust and anger. When I recognize what I am thinking, I pray to Jesus and Mary, but I still struggle. What else can I do?

When angry and lustful thoughts enter our consciousness, we should say a prayer and turn our mind to something else. Such thoughts become sins only when we deliberately encourage them or when we make plans to commit the sin. The thoughts themselves are temptations, not sins.

Continue to put your trust in Jesus and Mary and try to focus on what is good and peaceful. You might also consider what you are letting into your thoughts or imagination: What are you watching on TV or the internet? What music are you listening to? What are you reading? Are those helping to shape your thoughts and imagination in a new direction, or are they contributing to the problem?

A good thing to turn your attention to is God's word in Scripture. You might want to memorize all or part of the following New Testament verse: "Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (Philippians 4:8). Peacefully reflect on these words when troubled by temptation.

# WORD FROM POPE FRANCIS

Homily, Iraq, March 7, 2023



**St. Katharine Drexel** - Feast Day is March 3rd. She was an American Catholic heiress, philanthropist, and educator, who founded a religious order - the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, which served Black and Indigenous Americans. Being the second American-born saint, she was the first born as a U.S. citizen. Pope John Paul II both beatified and canonized her during his pontificate. She's the patron saint of racial justice and philanthropists. She's also noted for her love of the Eucharist, her efforts to achieve

quality education for all, and her selfless service, which included donating her inheritance for victims of injustice.



**Sts. Perpetua and Felicity** - Feast Day is March 7th. These two young women were Christian martyrs of the 3<sup>rd</sup> century, who lived during the early persecution of the church in Carthage, North Africa. Vibia Perpetua was a 22 yr. old noblewoman, who was a newly married and well-educated mother of an infant son. Felicity was a 20-21 yr. old slave woman, who was pregnant and imprisoned with Perpetua. They were both martyred for their faith with the sword after being wounded by wild animals. Prior to their execution, they gave each other the kiss of peace. They're the patron saints of mothers, who have lost their children.



**<u>St. John of God</u>** - Feast Day is March 8th. He was a Portuguese soldier turned health-care worker in Spain in the 15th-16<sup>th</sup> centuries. Having turned away from God in his early life, he repented receiving mercy and began his new commitment to love others and showed selfless dedication with great humility. God blessed him with gifts of prudence, patience, courage, enthusiasm, and the ability to inspire others. His followers later formed the Brothers Hospitallers of St. John of God, who cared for the poor, sick, and those with mental disorders. He's the patron saint of hospitals, nurses, heart patients, and booksellers.
