Unlike all the preceding prophets, Jesus does not simply convey God's word and commands, he is God's word in the flesh. His power derives from the Father, for he and the Father are one.

Dear Padre

Why is the Old Testament part of Christian worship? Parts of the Old Testament seem to be opposed to the teachings of Christ.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says it best: "The Old Testament is an indispensable part of Sacred Scripture. Its books are divinely inspired and retain a permanent value, for the Old Covenant has never been revoked" (*CCC* 121).

The Old Testament, also referred to as the Hebrew Scriptures, is the only Bible Jesus ever knew. That is an important reason to try to understand these Scriptures. The Pentateuch (first five books), the prophets, the Book of Psalms, and the wisdom writings all had a profound impact on Jesus. His image of God as Father, his preaching, his parables, and his proclamation of the reign of God were all influenced by the Hebrew Scriptures.

It is true that Jesus' preaching also goes beyond the Old Testament. At times he substitutes what the law has to say with an even more demanding requirement (see, for example, the Sermon on the Mount). In general, however, the Old Testament forms a context for understanding what Jesus was doing. His passion and death made no sense to his first followers except in light of the Suffering Servant of the Old Testament (Isaiah 52:13–53:12). There are many more examples like this one. Thus, the *Catechism* says "the Old Testament bears witness to the whole divine

Saints and Feasts of the Week

St. Thomas Aquinas - Feast Day is January 28th. He was an Italian Dominican friar and priest, who was a brilliant and influential philosopher, theologian, jurist, and Doctor of the Church. His combination of theological and philosophical ideas greatly influenced Roman Catholic doctrine for

centuries and he believed that natural reason could prove God's existence. He's the patron saint of universities and scholars. Nicknamed the "Dumb Ox" by his peers due to his being of large size and slow in speech, he showed us how to live for Jesus.



Presentation of the Lord - Feast Day is February 2nd. This combined feast commemorates Mary's ritual purification and Jesus' ritual redemption as the firstborn son, according to Jewish Law. Celebrated 40 days after the birth of Jesus, Mary and Joseph had brought Baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem. They came to complete the ritual

Purification of Mary after childbirth and then to consecrate Jesus to the Lord with a sacrificial offering. This day is also known as Candlemas Day, when candles are lighted to symbolize Jesus being "a light for revelation to the Gentiles."
