




Tenants of the Vineyard

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus tells the parable of the vineyard that was leased out to tenants. When the owner's servants came to collect the



pay, the tenants beat them. When the owner sent his son, they killed the son because they thought they would be able to take the vineyard if the son was dead.

This story is about God's people. For hundreds of years God cared for His people, leaving leaders in



the leaders did not respect Him. In fact, they killed Him on the cross! God's people were like the vineyard and the leaders were like the tenants who killed the son.

In a way your life is like a vineyard too. God has given it to you and cared for you all your life. When God wants you to do something for Him, you have the choice of doing what He asks or being like the bad tenants and

Saints and Feasts of the Week



St. John XXIII – Feast Day is October 11th. St. John XXIII was an Italian Pope of the Catholic Church from Oct. 1958 – June 1963. Known as "The Good Pope," he was one of the most popular and beloved popes of all time. He lived a virtuous life and opened the Second Vatican Council, which led to the modernization of the Church. He initiated major changes such as allowing priests to say Mass in the vernacular and recognizing other faiths. He is remembered for his teachings about peace and dialogue in the global world. He was chosen as the patron saint of the Italian Army.



St. Callistus I - Feast Day is October 14th. He was an Italian Pope from 218-222. He is noted for admitting church converts from sects or schisms, who had not done penance. He caused a major controversy by choosing to emphasize God's mercy in his ministry by establishing the practice of absolution of all sins including adultery and murder. He was martyred for his Christian faith and is the patron saint of cemetery workers.
