

# **Second Sunday of Advent December 10, 2023**

Readings for next week:

Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11

1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

John 1:6~8, 19~28

FOCUS: Prepare for the coming of the Lord.

Today's readings speak to us of preparing for the coming of the Lord through repentance. Repentance requires us to be honest about the times we have fallen short in loving God and our neighbor as the Lord commands. Knowing that we are sinners is a necessary step in recognizing our need for the forgiveness God has graciously offered us through his Son, whose coming into the world we prepare to celebrate.



## **Second Sunday of Advent**

The main theme for the second week of Advent is **Peace**. The Messiah would bring peace and justice to the nations. The second purple candle is lit and is called the "Bethlehem Candle." Our readings focus on preparing the way of the Lord starting with the first reading from the prophet Isaiah and concluding with Mark's gospel, in which we reflect on the role of John the Baptist in preaching repentance in preparation for the salvation Jesus would bring to the world. We continue to prepare our hearts and homes for Christ's birth in the world today.

## Dear Padre

Do Catholics have to marry in the Church? If a couple decides to marry outside of the Church, are they still allowed to receive Communion and other sacraments?

Catholics are obligated to follow the laws of the Church, including those laws regarding marriage. If a Catholic marries outside the Church, meaning that they did not follow Church law, then they may not receive the other sacraments until their marriage has been witnessed by the Church.

A wedding is a sacred ceremony for the couple, but it is also a ceremony for the Church. The Christian community is called upon to witness the ceremony, with the bishop, priest, or deacon called upon to bless the union in the name of the Church. The Church can dispense from the form, that is, the place of the wedding, for good cause, and does so when necessary. When a dispensation from the law is granted, then the person has followed the marriage laws of the Church and is free to receive the sacraments.

A wedding is a sacred ceremony in which a sacrament is conferred. While the park may be pretty or the church down the street may be bigger, neither is a sufficient reason to ignore marriage law and marry outside the Church.

### Saints and Feasts of the Week

<u>Our Lady of Guadalupe</u> – Feast Day is December 12<sup>th</sup>. This feast commemorates the apparition of Mary to the Mexican peasant, Juan Diego in 1531. She is the patron saint of Mexico and this day is an important holiday there. Her messages given were love and compassion and her universal promise of help & protection to all.

<u>St. Lucy</u> – Feast Day is Dec. 13<sup>th</sup>. This feast commemorates Lucia of Syracuse in Sicily, an early 4<sup>th</sup> century virgin martyr. She is the patron saint of the blind, those with eye trouble, and the Caribbean Island of St. Lucia. Legend has it that she brought food to Christians hiding in the dark Roman Catacombs, lighting her way with a candlelit wreath on her head. She is represented holding a dish with 2 eyes on it and holding a palm branch which symbolizes martyrdom and victory over evil.





**St. John of the Cross, Doctor of the Church** – Feast Day is Dec. 14<sup>th</sup>. He was a Spanish Carmelite friar and patron saint of mystics, contemplatives, and Spanish poets. He was a major figure of the Counter Reformation in Spain and the price of reform involved his imprisonment in which he experienced the dying of Jesus as he sat for months in his cell with only his God. He was "of the Cross" – the cross that leads to union with God. He inspired many to pursue God into the mysterious heights and depths of divine love.
