BAPTISM: Inform the parish 2 months in advance to allow for baptismal preparation FAITH FORMATION (CCD & OCIA): Contact


MARRIAGE: Notify the parish 6 months prior to proposed date. Attending an Engaged Encounter Weekend is required prior to marriage ceremony.

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time **August 24, 2025**

FOCUS: God offers salvation to all in the person of his only Son.

God's desire is that we love him and serve him and are united to him for eternity. We are called by baptism to the salvation that he offers through his Son. What matters is our response to that loving and life-giving invitation: how we live out our lives as faithful disciples makes the ultimate difference. It is our witness that will encourage others to hear and respond to God's call to them

THE NARROW GATE FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

Some people find love in their lives; others complain of loneliness. Some find peace, while others seem to be perpetually angry. Some live comfortably amid human diversity, yet others insist that the rest of the world be like them. There are those who are able to forgive and compromise and offer compassion and those who cannot. The difference seems to be the ability to forgo one's own desires for the sake of a greater good or the common good.

Such may be the narrow gate through which some may not be strong enough to enter. Phrases like the kingdom of God or the kingdom of heaven are not just references to places to which we go but also ways of being or states of existence. They all refer to God's presence, to life with God. You've heard people say they were so happy that they felt it was like heaven on earth. It wasn't a place they went but an experience of being filled with joy and peace. It's pure gift. No one ever finds it by focusing on oneself. It is the narrow gate by which we find our way into such a life. It is the doorway of caring for others.

Dear Padre, August 24, 2025

My wife mentioned that neither the Book of Mormon nor the Catholic Bible mentions purgatory.

The Church does not officially regard Mary as a co-redemptrix with Christ. Her "unique holiness'... 'from the first instant of her conception' comes wholly from Christ: she is 'redeemed, in a more exalted fashion, by reason of the merits of her Son'" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 492). According to Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, the title "co-redemptrix" would "obscure" the origin that "everything comes through Christ," as written in Ephesians and Colossians. "Mary, too, is everything she is through Him," stated the future Pope Benedict XVI, adding that "co-redemptrix" is a departure "from the language of Scripture and of the Fathers, and therefore gives rise to misunderstandings." Likewise, in 2019, Pope Francis quoted St. Bernard, who said that no praise is suffi cient to talk about Mary, but, ultimately, her title as a humble "disciple" best represents Mary's faithfulness to "her Son, the only Redeemer." "She never wanted for herself something that was of her Son," explained the pontiff. "She never introduced herself as co-redemptrix. No. Disciple." Pope Francis reiterated the Church's position on this matter in 2021, saying that Jesus entrusted the universal Church and all the faithful to Mary, "Not as a goddess. Not as a co-redemptrix. As a mother." Incidentally, "Mother of God" (Greek: Theotokos, "God-bearer") is Mary's oldest title, established in 431 by the Council of Ephesus.

FEASTS AND SAINTS OF THE WEEK



St. Louis of France - Feast Day is Aug. 25th. This 13th c. French king, also known as Louis IX, reigned for 44 years and was the only French king to be canonized a saint. He was primarily known for his piety, justice, and leadership during the Crusades. He was deeply devoted to God and the Church and participated actively in religious life. He also founded hospitals and charitable institutions. He was committed to justice with his just rule of seeking fair treatment for all of his subjects. He led two crusades, but was captured in the 6th one and died of disease during the 7th. He's the patron saint of France, Secular Franciscan Order, various crafts, barbers, button makers, and sculptors. He leaves a legacy of peace and unity in France, which can be attributed to his personality and strong moral character.



St. Monica - Feast Day is Aug. 27th. A model of patience, this 4th c. saint from Northern Africa was the mother of another well-known saint, Augustine of Hippo. She remained steadfast in prayer for many years and along with a strong well-disciplined character was instrumental in his conversion to Christianity. In her difficult family life, she also persevered and overcame other adversities. Because of her constant prayer, unwavering faith, trust in God's perfect timing, and virtuous living, she was successful in resolving other difficult family situations and even guided her pagan husband and his mother to convert to Christianity. She's the patron saint of mothers, married women, difficult marriages, victims of adultery, victims of verbal abuse, and conversion of relatives. Her famous quote was "I cried to the Lord in my distress and He answered me."



St. Augustine of Hippo - Feast Day is Aug. 28th. This 4th & 5th c. theologian, philosopher, writer, and preacher became Bishop of Hippo in North Africa in the late Roman period. A convert to Chrisitanity through the persistent prayers of his mother, St. Monica, he was considered a major figure in the development of Western Christianity. He's well remembered for his contributions to Christian theology and for his influential writings: "Confessions" and "The City of God." As a dedicated bishop, he served for many years by actively preaching, engaging with the community, and addressing their controversies. He emphasized the importance of spiritual growth, repentance, and love of God and neighbor, as well as concern for the poor and marginalized by

ensuring their needs were provided by the Church. He's the patron saint of brewers, printers, theologians, and the Augustinian Order.
