



Saints and Feasts of the Week



St. Margaret Mary Alacoque – Feast Day is October 16th. She was a French Catholic Visitation nun and mystic, who promoted devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus throughout the Western Church. She received several visions of Jesus, who asked her to spread the love of His Heart through her and to reveal to many people the grace He desires to bestow on humanity. She is the patron saint of devotees of the Sacred Heart, of polio patients, and against the death of parents.



St. Luke – Feast Day is October 18th. He was one of the four evangelists, who wrote the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. His gospel is considered the most poetic and beautiful of all of them and emphasizes Christ's compassion for sinners and caring for those who suffer. Trained as a physician, he was a disciple of Jesus and the only Gentile to have written books in the bible. He is the patron saint of physicians, surgeons, artists, students, bachelors, and butchers.



<u>St. Paul of the Cross</u> - Feast Day is October 20th. He was an Italian Catholic mystic and founder of the Passionists, an order of Missionary priests. In addition to taking the 3 main vows, his order takes a 4th one to spread the memory of Christ's suffering before His Crucifixion. He intercedes for travelers across the sea, homilists, and students. He's the patron saint of Hungary.
