



October is the Month of the Holy Rosary

This month, we will have special events to honor our Blessed Mother through the recitation of the rosary. Please save the dates for the following:

Each weekend during the month of October, we will be praying the rosary before Mass as a faith community led by assigned parishioners of various ministries. On Saturdays and Sundays, rosary will begin at 4:15 p.m. prior to the 5 p.m. Masses. On Sunday mornings, rosary will start at 6:15 a.m. prior to the 7 a.m. Masses and at 8:45 a.m. prior to the 9:30 a.m. Masses.

1. September 28 – October 6th, Feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary Novena:

In honor of the month of the Holy Rosary, the First Saturday Marian Devotional group started a 9-day Novena for Feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary on September 28th. Rosary begins at 7:15 a.m. prior to the 8 am Mass, except on Thu., Oct. 5th, where it will begin at 8:30 a.m.

2. October 7th, Saturday, Feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary:

Our First Saturday Marian Devotions will be held at 3:00 p.m. as usual in the church.

Saints and Feasts of the Week

Holy Guardian Angels, Oct. 2nd – This day recognizes the protective role that guardian angels have in our lives. Each one of us has an angel who protects us against spiritual and physical evil. They help us on our journey through life with their watchful care and intercession. We celebrate this Feast by honoring them with extra prayers namely the Angelus Dei (Angel of God) prayer. They remain always by our side.



St. Francis of Assisi, Oct. 4th, **Patron Saint of Italy, Ecology, and Animals -** He was an Italian mystic and a Catholic Friar who founded the 3 Orders of the Franciscans. He led a life of poverty as an itinerant (traveling) preacher. He's known for his miracles with animals and birds. He lived the gospel putting his faith into action by giving to others. He received the stigmata of Christ and was devoted to the Eucharist.



St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, Oct. 5th, Patron Saint of Gratitude in the Family – She was a Polish Catholic religious sister in the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. She received visions of Jesus and became His apostle of Divine Mercy. God chose her to proclaim the truth about His mercy to the world and implore His mercy for sinners through forms of devotion, such as the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Jesus asked her to record her mystical experiences into notebooks known today as the Diary of St. Faustina Kowalska.
