

What is a "covenant," and how are marriage and covenant related?

"Covenant" is the word the Church employs to define and describe the sacrament of matrimony. It is clearly based on the idea of "covenant" contained in Scripture. In contrast, society uses the related word "contract," as in the "marriage contract." However, these two words do not mean the same thing.

The meaning of "contract" is too limited to contain the full commitment of Christian marriage. When you sign a contract, you are legally bound only to its terms. You need not do more or less than what is stipulated in its wording. Warmth and concern for the well-being of one party for the other are not stipulated in a contract.

A covenant, on the other hand, is different. Although it may contain some aspects of contract, it establishes a personal relationship of closeness, affection, and warmth, and it locks the couple into a mutual commitment to each other's well-being.

As God freely chose Israel from all the nations possible, so do two people choose each other from all other people. As God declared, "I will take you as my people, and I will be your God" (Exodus 6:7). In the same way, a husband and wife pledge total commitment to each other.

Christian marriage bears the same characteristics of covenant commitment—the personal relationship of caring, loyalty, intimacy, exclusivity, permanency, and, above all, love; hence the use of "covenant" to define Christian marriage.

All are invited to join the **Mass** for the Clergy and Religious who are celebrating their Jubilee anniversaries on April 20th, 10 a.m. at Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa.

He was a Civil War veteran who served in the leprosy settlement of Kalaupapa, Hawaii, 1886 to 1931, in atonement, he said, for his turbulent post-war years. He assisted St. Damien de Veuster and St. Marianne Cope primarily as "dresser of sores." He served for some 44 years until his death on March 26, 1931. In the next couple of weeks, the Diocese will be taking up a second collection for his cause to sainthood. If he is canonized, we will have our 3rd saint from Hawaii. (Hawaii Catholic Herald file)



Saints of the Week

St. Bernadette Soubirous - Feast Day is April 16th. Aka Bernadette of Lourdes, she was a 19th century French nun, who belonged to the order of the Sisters of Charity. While she was only 14 years old, she experienced a series of 18 apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary at a grotto near her small town. During this time, spontaneous healings occurred, many of which were miraculous, at the spring there. This "young lady" who appeared to Bernadette identified herself as the "Immaculate Conception" and asked that a chapel be built at the nearby cave-grotto. This grotto has become a major pilgrimage site and Marian shrine, known as the Sanctuary of our Lady of Lourdes. About 5 million pilgrims flock to this site

each year. It's interesting to note that during the 3rd vision, our Lady "promised to make Bernadette happy, not in this life, but in the other." Her body lies incorrupt in a chapel of a convent in Nevers, France, where many pilgrims also visit and ask for her intercession. This humble saint is the patron of bodily illness and of Lourdes, France.
